# REPORT

Dear Members and Supporters,

I am pleased to present to you the Annual Report of Bocce Australia (BA) for the year 2022/23. This report serves as a comprehensive overview of our achievements, challenges, and progress over the past year. As we reflect on our accomplishments, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to our dedicated members, volunteers, and supporters who have contributed to our success.

This year has been a pivotal one for Bocce Australia. It marked a period of significant change and adaptation as we navigated through the unique challenges presented by the ongoing global events. It's interesting to consider this past 12 months as a potential milestone when life returned to pre-COVID conditions, and various aspects of life, work, and sports were back in full swing, albeit in a different manner. Adapting to the "new normal" has been a significant challenge for many organizations, including national sports bodies like Bocce Australia.

In this context, it was important for Bocce Australia to recognize the need to adapt and change to the evolving circumstances. The COVID-19 pandemic forced many sports organizations to reevaluate their strategies and operations. To ensure the sport's continued relevance and growth, Bocce Australia needed to consider various changes, which were necessary to put in place which we did, such as:

**Digital Transformation:** Embracing technology to enhance the sport's visibility and accessibility. This included developing digital platforms for engagement, information, communication, and membership management.

**National Policies:** Implementing and promoting policies and protocols to ensure the safety of players, officials and spectators in the post-COVID world.

**Community Engagement:** Focusing on community engagement and grassroots development to reignite and grow interest in the sport. Created the National Development Officer position to promote, develop and expand the sport beyond its current demographic was a necessary investment. The sport needed to have a kick-start to attract new communities. Vinay Singh and John Inglese filled this position and both were instrumental in advancing the sport of bocce in their unique way.

**Adaptive Rules:** Modifying rules or formats to make the sport more adaptable to different circumstances, including potential disruptions in the future. John in particular helped to develop the Bocce Team Challenge which is in use as the entry competition to the sport of Bocce. He also put in place a development working group and the first bocce conference after a 20 year absence.

**Youth Development:** Investing in youth development programs is a crucial step in ensuring the future of any sport. The youth are not only the players of tomorrow but also the fans and supporters who will sustain the

sport for generations to come. The success of the BA's participation in the Denis Ravera Bocce Challenge in Monaco, has garnered increased interest and contributed to the growth of our junior ranks, and is a testament to the positive impact of such initiatives.

**Marketing and Promotion:** Increasing efforts in marketing and promotion to attract sponsors, fans, and media attention. We were fortunate to enlist Robert 'Dipper' Di Pierdomenico, as our Bocce Sport ambassador who gave his time for free, a true philanthropist volunteer for the sport of bocce.

**International Collaboration:** Collaborating with other national and international bocce organizations to learn from their experiences and share best practices. Nationally we embraced Special Olympics Bocce into our Nationals and after such a success they are now part of our National Championship format. Globally we have Tony Biancacci VP FIB and General Secretary of CBI and Sonia Fava FIB Women's Coordinator General along with Joe Maselli and Vanessa Allegretto as International Referees—Bocce Volo.

The post-pandemic world accelerated the need for innovation and flexibility in the world of sports, and organizations that embraced change are likely to thrive in this evolving landscape. By proactively addressing these challenges, Bocce Australia has positioned itself for a successful future, ensuring that the sport remains vibrant and relevant.

**Key Highlights:** Mission Impact: Bocce Australia continued to make a meaningful impact on our vision of bocce being a sport for all ages, all genders, all abilities and all communities. We expanded the sports appeal, with Bocce Team Challenge, we embraced all abilities with the inclusion of Special Olympics Bocce, and reached out to specialised individuals to help with coaching, refereeing, volunteers, sponsorship and marketing our new bocce programs.

Financial Stability: Due to the need to invest in these new initiatives monies needed to be spent and for this year we see a dip in our financial health but now we have a stronger foundation to bounce back next year, thanks to the support of our sponsors, grants, and the responsible management of our resources. This allowed us to sustain our existing programs and explore new opportunities.

Community Engagement: We witnessed an incredible surge in community engagement, both in person and online. This year, we hosted Bocce Team Challenge, Bocce n Bubbles, and Com-N-Try events which brought together nationally over 135 new participants and 10 new volunteers. Our online presence also expanded significantly, with 1,400 regular followers on social media platforms.

Innovation and Adaptation: In response to the changing landscape, we adapted our strategies to better serve our community. This included expanded the nationals, included Special Olympics Bocce and new innovations made, such as the introduction of new programs, the BTC, technology adoption, TIDYHQ and policies.

Collaborations and Partnerships: We fostered strong partnerships with like-minded organizations, furthering our reach and impact. Together, we worked on initiatives that leveraged our collective strengths to address specific issue or challenge. We strengthen our partnership with Bon Food, Macron and premier clubs such as Club Marconi, Catholic Liverpool Club, Morwell Club, Kyabram Bocce Club, Redlands Club Qld, Casa D'Abruzzo Club, Furlan Club and Veneto Club Melbourne.

Membership Growth: Bocce Australia welcomed 30 new members this year, a testament to our continued appeal and the importance of our mission. These were in both in the Bocce Raffa and Bocce Volo disciplines of Bocce Sport, however we are still experiencing a decline due to our aging demographic.

Challenges: Of course, we faced our share of challenges this year. The failure to implement a National Super League-type competition, which was the collective desire of elite and junior players, was a significant setback. This initiative was driven by the aspiration for more year-round competition and aimed to bridge the gap between states and clubs, providing a platform for high-level competition and skill enhancement. Unfortunately, the dream of a national league remained unfulfilled due to the lack of sponsorship and club support. Another challenge we faced was the aging membership, which highlighted the importance of recruiting and retaining younger participants. Addressing the needs and interests of different demographics within our organization became a priority and as a collective we need to address urgently to get the 'J' curve.

Furthermore, economic fluctuations and regulatory changes added to the complexity of our operating environment. We had to navigate through financial uncertainties and adapt to new regulations that impacted our events and operations.

However, I am proud to report that Bocce Australia responded to these challenges with creativity, determination, and unity. We remained steadfast in our commitment to our mission, even in the face of adversity. While the road ahead may still hold uncertainties, we are more determined than ever to overcome these challenges, adapt to the changing landscape, and continue to promote the sport of bocce in Australia. We believe that by working together and staying true to our vision, we can overcome these obstacles and emerge stronger, ensuring a bright future for bocce in our nation.

#### **Vision for the Future:**

Looking ahead, we remain committed to our core values and mission. Bocce Australia envisions a future where bocce sport is the choice sport for all ages, all genders, all abilities and all communities. To achieve this vision, we will continue working on our main three pillars—Juniors, Lifestyle & Elite as priorities for the coming year.

I am confident that with the unwavering support of our members, volunteers, staff, and sponsor partners, we can look forward to a future filled with even greater achievements and milestones.

The next 12 months we will work closely with Sport Australia as we refine the sports governance and prepare to implement the Bocce One changes. The key focus is to promote, raise awareness of and encourage participation in bocce sport for benefits of health, longevity, fitness, skill, achievement, social interaction, wellbeing and other benefits of exercise for all individuals in Australia.

The focus will be to continue the emphasis of bocce to being administered and run as a sport and no longer oscillating between the social and sporting aspects of the game. We encourage through our member states to work closely with our affiliated clubs to put in place programs to facilitate the sports entry and player pathways so that participation is easier for novice players of all ages, all abilities, and all cultures.

I would like to thank Sport Australia for their support and recognise the enormous contribution they make to bocce sport. Most importantly, thanks to all of you who contribute to Bocce sport. It is your unwavering drive and passion to see bocce succeed that inspires us to strive for new heights in what we deliver each and every day.

To our sponsors, partners and supporters, without your financial and in-kind support, effort and energy, Bocce sport would not be where we are today. In particular thanks must go to our premier partners Australian Sports Commission, the State Governments, Member States and affiliate clubs who have helped in every way to continue to make Bocce Sport a reality – a big thank you. 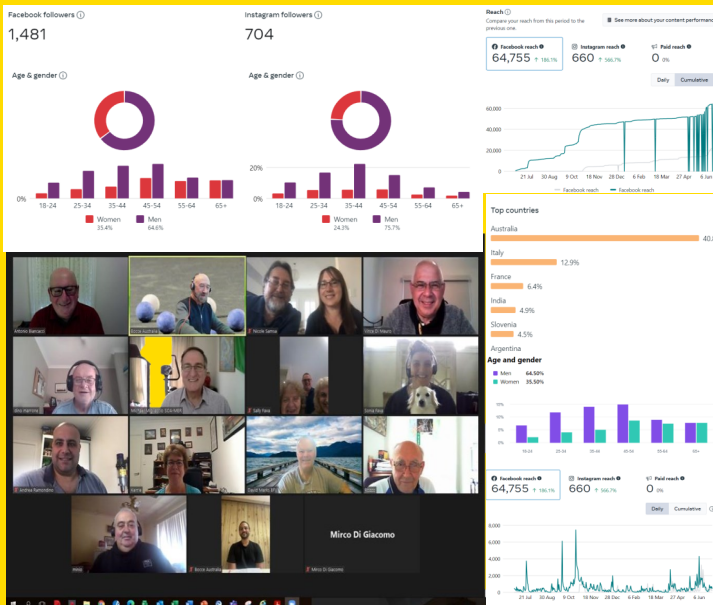

## REPORT

In 2019 the Australian Sport Commission (ASC) mandated all National Sport Organisations (NSO) to transition to an incorporated company or risk ongoing support as a recognised NSO. As a result, on the 18 December 2020, Bocce Federation Australia incorporated association in Victoria transitioned to an Incorporated Company Bocce Australia Limited (CLG) and is registered with the Australian Securities and Investment Commission (ASIC) as public company limited by guarantee (CLG). This is the preferred ASIC structure for non-for-profit community-based organisations which limits the contribution should the company be wound up.)

Corporate Governance and Compliance are critical in public company's and as such all sporting codes under the ASC must comply. To standardise corporate governance and financial compliance ASC heavily invested into an online website 'Sport Australia (SportAus) Partner Portal' as its source of truth - one stop shop. Although we are not a large sporting code, BA is not exempt from the rigorous annual reporting and compliance requirements.

BA works closely with its Sport Australia's partners to ensure we comply and meet its deadlines; the list below demonstrates some of our requirements:

- An annual activity participation plan which includes Come 'n' Try and Bocce Team Challenge and Competition enhancement programs,
- Governance and Organisational Enhancement (GOE) plan which is a Board Governance Program (revamped in 2023 and included in the online partner portal),
- Annual Financial Acquittal process,
- Annual Child safeguard Declaration,
- Attend monthly Sport and Finance Advisory meetings and education programs,
- Financial statements tailored to SportAus requirements.
- Sport Integrity Australia (SIA), National Integrity Framework (NIF) policies, and National Sports Tribunal (NST) program issued in July 2023 already adopted, with a further review of these policies in September 2023 saw BA adopt the enhanced polices to commence 1 January 2024:
  - NIF Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy,
  - NIF Complaints Disputes and Discipline Policy,
  - NIF Competition Manipulation and Sport Gambling Policy,
  - NIF Improper Use of Drugs and Medicine Policy, and
  - NIF Member Protection Policy

During the Pandemic sporting downtime, SportAus permitted all NSO's to carry forward prior year funds with the intent to develop and promote bocce. During the 2023 senior SportAus officials attended the Junior event held in (Redlands) Brisbane and the (Bulleen) Bocce Team Challenge in Victoria. The positive feedback received is extremely rewarding.

In respect to our 2022-23 finances, BA has returned to its usual calendar of competition events and invested in Sport Development and Promotion. On the back of a return to bocce competitions and stimulating interest in Bocce, BA recorded a \$59.5k loss. BA's balance sheet remains cash flow positive and holds no long-term creditor commitments/ liabilities to outside parties.

The Financial Year 2022-2023 Financial Statements are finalised and audited by GMB Accountants and would like to thank them for their services. These will be posted on the Bocce Australia Website and forwarded to SportAus.

Finally, thank you everyone for your commitment and support during 2022-23 and we look forward to another fantastic Bocce year.

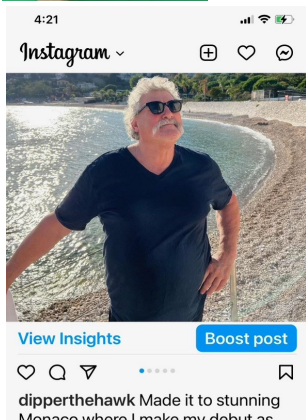

WHO said bocce was a sport for old people? Italian Australian Club Morwell young guns Ayden Respodino and Kayla Dukes are flying the flag for the current generation.

Respodino has just returned home from Monaco, after competing at international level, while Kayla recently won the Under 15 singles at the national championships.

The former travelled to Monaco for five days to play with the Australian Under 23 team, along with fellow Morwell teammate Tom Campelli.

Speaking of the trip, Respodino said it was a great experience.

"It was unbelievable, it was just crazy, we just didn't know what to expect," he said.

"France took it home, we were a bit overwhelmed but we put up a fight."

Away from the court, Respodino said the team took the time to do some sightseeing, including checking out the world-famous grand prix track.

Speaking of overseas competition, the 20-year-old said it was eye-opening to see how grand bocce was on the world stage.

"Overseas it is massive, it is a full-on sport, it is very competitive," he said.

"Argentina did really well, we made lifelong friends with them, when they went home one of the guys was in a truck and he had fans as far as the eye could see, there is definitely support for it overseas."

Now that he is back home, Respodino said he would be looking to a number of city-based and interstate events, with a view to move mainly into 'rapid' formats of bocce.

Rapid forms of bocce involve players running up and down the court after throwing, adding a great deal of excitement to the sport.

With the courts at Italian Australian Club often described as 'world class', Respodino was pleased to have now competed overseas.

"The verdict?"

"These courts are really good, I would rate them higher than the courts overseas," he said.

"Frank (Fava) takes good care of them. I'm proud to be able to train on these courts, I think they are really good."

A glowing endorsement indeed for little old Morwell.

Kayla Dukes' star is rising in bocce.
